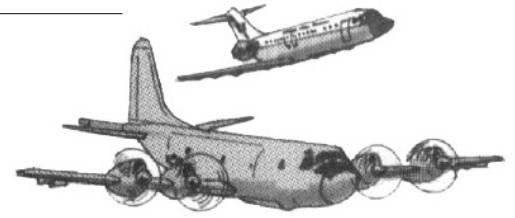

ANA Whidbey Project Proposal

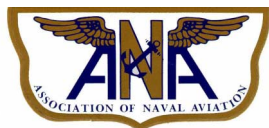
Your executive board has discovered an A-3 wind tunnel test model for sale. It’s about 1/15th scale (which measures 57 inches long, 57 inches wide - wingspan) and weighs about 70 pounds with the stand. The material is unknown, but it is probably wood or resin. It is an A-3D1 (original production) with the 20mm turrets in the rear and painted in the original glossy sea blue of the mid-50’s. The owner would like \$500 for the model, but he would probably take less — especially, if he can detail the model with his dad’s name and markings. His dad is CAPT “Deke” Forbes, former CO of VAH-123 (1968-69). Some of you may remember Deke, who now lives in the DC area.
